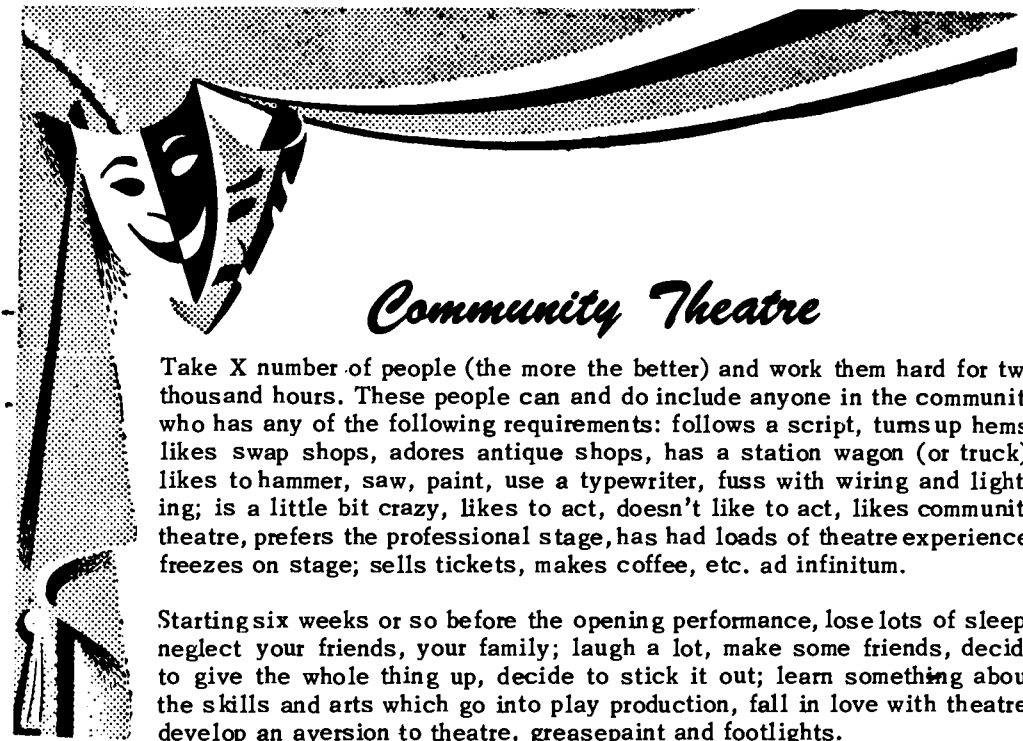

Community Theatre

Take X number of people (the more the better) and work them hard for two thousand hours. These people can and do include anyone in the community who has any of the following requirements: follows a script, turns up hems, likes swap shops, adores antique shops, has a station wagon (or truck); likes to hammer, saw, paint, use a typewriter, fuss with wiring and lighting; is a little bit crazy, likes to act, doesn't like to act, likes community theatre, prefers the professional stage, has had loads of theatre experience, freezes on stage; sells tickets, makes coffee, etc. ad infinitum.

Starting six weeks or so before the opening performance, lose lots of sleep, neglect your friends, your family; laugh a lot, make some friends, decide to give the whole thing up, decide to stick it out; learn something about the skills and arts which go into play production, fall in love with theatre, develop an aversion to theatre, greasepaint and footlights.

If you are a director, learn to speak softly, develop a good bluster, and take a rest cure when it's all over.

If you are a member of the cast, learn your lines quickly (Showoff), don't learn your lines quickly (the rest of the cast), move well, freeze up, fuss with the backstage crew, learn to get along with people; criticize the set, design a better one.

If you are a member of the backstage crew, do your work well, don't do it well, find something to fuss about with at least one member of the cast, get along with the cast.

Mix all these ingredients until dress rehearsal, at which time the auditorium will be a department of utter confusion, a time when best laid plans gang aft alee. Have a successful opening night, give a benefit, clip the reviews, paste them in your scrapbook, take a good long rest.

Do this three times a year.

It is a pleasant theatrical custom to visit with the cast and crew backstage after the performance. You are therefore invited to join with the company backstage after the final curtain. The cast and crew will be pleased to see you and you will find much of interest "behind the scene."

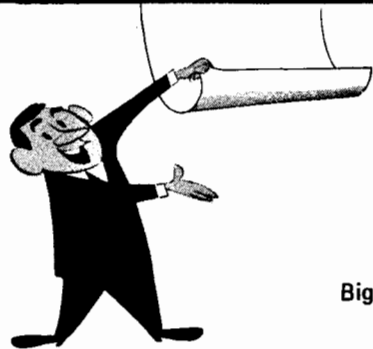

THE DIRECTORS

RICHARD BRICKWELL: Mr. Brickwell was director for "OLIVER" last season, his debut with the Players. He teaches and directs plays at Downers Grove High School South. He has appeared in the title role in "Fiorello" in a Summer Alumni Production. We are pleased to have him again this year.

LON T. MAY: (Musical Director) Mr May also teaches vocal music at South High and is in his fifth season as musical director for Grove Players. Ever since "Pajama Game", GP has been fortunate enough to have Mr. May directing the principals and chorus in their musical numbers as well as our orchestra. His son Michael is appearing in tonight's show.

LAURA H. GRANT: (Choreographer) Mrs. Grant maintains two dance studios and teaches nearly every day. She has choreographed every Grove Players musical since we started with "Pajama Game". She also works actively with local and nearby high schools in staging dance numbers for their musicals.

THE CAST

(In order of appearance)

CHUCK BALCH (Hobson) has appeared in all the Grove Players musicals thus far and has also acted in "How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying" (St. Procopious Productions) and has appeared in "Solid Gold Cadillac" (Lisle Players). Chuck, in addition to acting in "Walking Happy", is also production manager.

DON MITCHELL (Beenstock) has appeared many times with the Grove Players. Some of the plays Don has appeared in are: "Bells Are Ringing", "Never Too Late", "Oliver", and "Solid Gold Cadillac". Don is also construction foreman for this show.

JERRY JUZWIAK (Minns) is from Naperville and a graduate of North Central College in Music Education. Jerry has appeared in a number of plays, both straight and musical at Summer Place, North Central Theatre Guild and Naperville Barn. Among these plays are "Wonderful Town", "Carousel", "Brigadoon", "Finian's Rainbow", "Music Man", "Mrs. McThing", "Macbeth", and "The Diary of Ann Frank". Jerry teaches music with an organization called Music for Children, Inc.

ART HANCOCK (Denton) Art is a Transportation Supervisor with Western Electric in Cicero. His interest is music, though, as well as telephones, since he is president of the Hawthorne Male Chorus, a 30 voice organization from the company for which he works. In this area Art plays piano and organ professionally.

GARY BISBEE (Tudsbury) Gary is a graduate of North Central College in the field of psychology and pre-med. He is now employed as an administrator at Wesley Memorial Hospital in Chicago. In college and at the Summer Place Theatre in Naperville he has appeared in diverse works by Mozart and Meredith Wilson.

JOHN L. LAZAROWICZ (Heeler) John has been with GP for one year and had his "baptism" last season in "Born Yesterday" playing Eddie Brock. This past summer John played Milt in GP's production of "Luv". He has done a great deal of backstage and light crew work and this year is co-chairman of Publicity.

LORNA LINDAMAN (Maggie) A fourteen year resident of the Chicago area, Lorna has appeared in the Oak Lawn Jubilee and in St. Louis with the St. Louis Light Opera Company in "Kiss Me, Kate", in the title role. Some of her voice training was with the Cosmopolitan School of Music in Kansas City, Missouri, and she has studied voice expression with Henri Noel. She is married to Walter Lindaman, Director of the Chamber of Commerce of Downers Grove.

BARBARA MARKS (Alice Hobson) In between acting and singing on stage in the role of Alice Hobson, Barb can be found backstage worrying over and sewing on costumes for this show. She is co-chairman for that big job, as she was for last years "Oliver". The season before that she starred as Ella Peterson in "Bells Are Ringing". She also appeared in "Anything Goes" for the Players and "Kismet" for College of DuPage Players. She is mother of three and lives in Villa Park with her husband Roy who is on the library staff at College of DuPage.

PATTI GOULD (Vickie Hobson) As Vickie Hobson, Patti is making her first appearance with the Grove Players. She is from Downers but has recently lived in Detroit where she appeared in "Grammercy Ghost" and "Never Too Late". She has also worked with The Summer Place Theatre Guild in Naperville.

RICHARD ALBRIGHT (Albert Beenstock) Richard is in his sixth show for Grove Players. His credits include all of GP's musicals, including playing Mr. Sowerberry in last years "Oliver". He also appeared in "Anastasia". With St. Procopius College Productions, he appeared in "How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying". He has been doing publicity for the group for two years. He is a teacher at Lyons Township High School.

JIM KIEL (Freddie Beenstock) is currently working under Mr. Brickwell in "A Man for All Seasons" as well as in "Walking Happy". He is a senior at DGHS South and works for Northwestern Theatre Associates.

IRMA BALCH (Mrs. Hepworth) Irma has appeared in the Grove Players production of "Holiday for Lovers", "Anything Goes", "Oliver", and "Born Yesterday". "Walking Happy" does hold a first for Irma, this is the only time that she has gotten to "sit" on stage.

JIM BERRILL (Toby) is presently a student at Northwestern University majoring in electrical engineering. Jim has appeared in such things as; "Oklahoma", "Unsinkable Molly Brown" & "Carousel". This is the first time Jim has appeared with the Grove Players. He is usually found backstage working on lights.

RON HOLOUS (Will Mossop) Ron is a versatile man-about-theatre who works very hard for the group, not only as President and Ticket Chairman, but backstage as well. He has been in "Pajama Game", "Anything Goes", "Bells Are Ringing", and was stage manager for "Oliver". He has been in too many straight productions for the group to mention here, but was last seen in "Born Yesterday". He studied at Goodman Theatre for two years and met his wife, Barbara, while working in summer stock in 1958. This is Ron's 17th season with Grove Players.

MAX WEBER (Footman) Mr. Weber appeared last season in "Born Yesterday" for GP and has done quite a number of shows over a 35 year span with groups in Newark, New Jersey, Albuquerque, New Mexico, and with Argonne Thespians at Argonne National Laboratory. He has worked with the Theatre of Western Springs.

SUE MEISER (Ada Figgins) Sue is a senior at Lyons Township High School and there has appeared in "Girl Crazy" and "Once Upon a Mattress". Last season she played Bet in "Oliver". She will major in music at Northern Illinois University.

PAULETTE SARUSSI (Mrs. Figgins) has appeared in the Grove Players production of "Anastasia" and is one of those "behind the scenes" people who has helped immeasurably.

ROZ MUELLER (A Customer) Roz has worked for GP for many seasons, chiefly back stage, having served on every committee except sound, and having headed most of them at one time or another. She's one of our hardest-working members. Last year she appeared in "Oliver". She sings with the Choralaires in Downers Grove.

CHORUS

ELAINE ALBRIGHT (Chorus) Elaine is, along with Barbara Marks, responsible for the costumes worn in tonight's show. Their combined talents also costumed "Oliver" last season. She has also appeared in "Pajama Game", "Bells Are Ringing", as well as "Oliver". She is married to a "devil" and lives in LaGrange with their two sons.

DORIS KELLY (Chorus) Doris is a secretary to the school principal for Hinsdale Public Schools. This is her first time with Grove Players. She has enjoyed singing all her life and considers it her hobby. She lives in Clarendon Hills with hubby and four children.

CHERYL LANGFORD (Chorus) This is the first time Cheryl has appeared with GP. She has appeared in a DGHS North "Oklahoma Operetta" and has been active in Childrens Theatre. Miss Langford is a third grade teacher at Hillcrest School in Downers Grove.

JERRY SUITS (Chorus) Before her marriage to Bill, Jerry took an MA in Vocal music at Northwestern University and taught in the Lisle Grade Schools. She is presently singing with the Chicago Symphony Chorus, and this summer she sang at Ravinia with that organization.

BILL SUITS (Chorus) A graduate of the University of Wisconsin with a chemistry major, Bill works as Assistant Product Manager for Packard Instrument Company. With GP, Bill has appeared in "Bells Are Ringing" and "Oliver". With College of DuPage he was in "Kismet" last spring. And for St. Procopius College he has appeared in a revue. Sports are Bill's big interest; he played in the Rose Bowl in 1960 for Wisconsin.

DAVID MUELLER (street boy) David made a memorable debut with Grove Players last year as the Sunday night Oliver in "Oliver". He attends Lincoln School where he has appeared in "Alice in Wonderland". He also sings in the school choir and plays trombone in the school band.

DANCERS

JANET ANDERS (Dancer) Jan is a senior at DGHS South. She plans to major in dance at college. Previous to working with GP she danced in the Alumni Summer production of "Carousel" and in "Music Man" at the Summer Place. She is a piano player as well as a dancer. In school she is a Pom Pom girl for DGHS.

LORLE BALCH (Dancer) is the daughter of Chuck and Irma Balch and has worked backstage on "Oliver", "Anastasia" and "Holiday for Lovers", (all GP productions) This is Lorle's first on stage appearance. She is presently a student at DGHS North.

ROSEMARY BOULA (Dancer) Rosemary goes to College of DuPage and works as a secretary for Becvarik, Wright, Inc. She has taken dancing for 13 years and has worked with GP in "Anything Goes" and "Bells Are Ringing". Remember the shoe into the audience bit in the "Midas Touch" number? Rose has also worked with St. Procopius College productions.

BARBARA HOLOUS (Dancer) Barb, along with dancing in this show, is assisting choreographer Laura H. Grant in the staging of the dance numbers. She has appeared in all GP musicals except "Oliver", and was helping husband Ron as Assistant Stage Manager for that show. She appeared last season as Billie in "Born Yesterday".

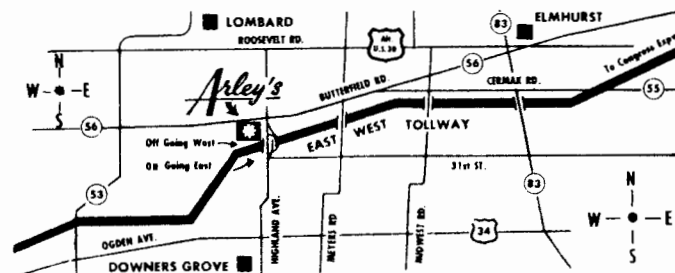
