# Who's Who

**Norman H. Wiegel (Director)** - Norm is chairman of the fine arts department at Triton College, where last summer he directed **Charley's Aunt**. He attended the University of Illinois and Northwestern University. Before his directing career, Norm acted with six Chicago-area community theater groups and three seasons of summer stock in Michigan and New York. Since then he has directed at the high school and college levels as well as for community theater groups, including **Grove Players** for which he directed **Cactus Flower** last season. Norm lives in La Grange.

**Rich Gannon (Producer, William)** - A school teacher from Westmont, Rich has appeared in a number of GP productions, including **Our Town** as Editor Webb, **Fiddler on the Roof** as Mendel, **Company** as Peter, **6 Rms Riv Vu** as Richard, **See How They Run** as the Russian, and in the choruses of many musicals. He has also worked with Naperville's Summer Place as Mr. DePinna in **You Can't Take it with You**, and with IBC Productions as Snoopy in **You're A Good Man, Charlie Brown**.

**Marge Uhlarik (Fiona)** - Celebrating her 25th birthday on the opening night of this production, Marge has been active in high school, college, and community theater for nearly half of her life - 11 years to be exact. Among her many roles on the GP stage are Corie in **Barefoot in the Park**, Tessie Tura in **Gypsy**, Lizzie in **The Rainmaker**, and, her favorite portrayal, Rosemary in **Picnic**. Marge of LaGrange Park, was director of GP's **Our Town** and assistant director of **Company**.

**Karen Erickson (Teresa)** - A drama teacher at Downers Grove North High School, Karen received her master's degree in theater from Illinois State University. She has appeared with GP in **Wait Until Dark** as Susy, and has also worked with other local groups, including the Banner Players in **The Mousetrap** as Mrs. Boyle, Summer Place as stage manager for **Ten Little Indians**, and Theatre of Western Springs as sound technician for **Relatively Speaking**. She and her husband, Ed, reside in Downers Grove.

**Bill Robson (Frank)** - A graduate of the American Conservatory of Music, Bill, of LaGrange, has served as musical director for GP's **Guys and Dolls**, **Fiddler on the Roof**, **Company**, **Hello, Dolly!**, and **Sound of Music**. He was also guest conductor for the West Suburban Symphony during the 1977-78 season. On GP's stage, he has performed as Duane in **Applause**, Hero in **A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum**, Rev. Toop in **See How They Run**, and Roat in **Wait Until Dark**.

**Ed Erickson (Bob)** - Ed earned his master's degree in theater from Illinois State University, where he performed in **Sticks and Bones** as Father Donald. With GP, Ed has appeared in **Wait Until Dark** and **Ten Little Indians**. He held roles in **Angel Street** at Summer Place and in **Richard II** with the Theatre of Western Springs, and was director of **Tartuffe** for the Downers Grove Thespian Alumni Players.

**Peggy Wiora (Mary)** - Making her first appearance with GP, Peggy appeared in **The Serpent** during college. A music education and piano major, she was choral director for the past three years at Fenton High School, Bensenville. While there, she was music director for **Oklahoma**, **Godspell**, and **How to Succeed in Business without Really Trying**. Peggy lives in Lisle and is a secretary.
